#### Kia ora koutou katoa

On the 17<sup>th</sup> May we were able to host the annual Rippa Rugby tournament, with teams from our Kāhui Ako schools attending. Congratulations to the students from Henley who participated and demonstrated sound sporting skills and values. Thank you to Mr Cade Armstrong and Mr Eion Sammes for supporting with coaching and managing the teams. The Henley Blue team came 3<sup>rd</sup> overall and will go to the regionals in week 10.

This week some Middle Syndicate classes have been visiting the Nelson Provincial Museum as part of an Aotearoa New Zealand Histories Social Science focus on local stories. They viewed the 'Treasured' exhibition and were hosted by Whaea Kelly who shared local stories and associated activities.



We were fortunate our Kāhui Ako received funding at the end of 2022 to support attendance in our schools. Our campus schools have employed Caroline Clarke on a fixed term contract, to fill the role of Attendance Support Co-ordinator. She will work across the campus to analyse attendance patterns, trends and specifically with Henley to help us raise attendance for students who are missing the equivalent of more than 1-2 days per week across the year. You will be aware regular attendance is a concern the government have been talking about in the last 12 months. Regular attendance (90% attendance or more) was considerably lower in 2022 for a large number of students at Henley School, and we are pleased to see this is improving in 2023. Currently, our school-wide data for 2023 shows 72.89% of students are attending school between 90-100% of the time. I will work closely with Caroline to identify and implement strategies to support more regular attendance for our students. Please let me know if your child is struggling to attend school regularly and we can make a plan together.

We have noticed a growing number of families walking their dogs to school at the beginning and end of the day. It is timely to remind you that all dogs must be on a short lead, are always under full control of the adult walking them and that we discourage children from playing with them at these times. You need to ensure you are with your dog at all times, therefore we are unable to have dogs tied up on the school grounds while you visit your child's classroom nor have them running freely on the back field during the school day. Although this can be inconvenient, we have many students and family members who are afraid of dogs, and we want everyone to feel safe on our school grounds. Please be responsible dog owners and ensure you remove any "doggie-do" from our grounds. We appreciate your support with this.

In the next newsletter you will receive a link to book a time for a Parent Teacher Conference on Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> June from 2.20pm. Please keep an eye out for the information coming home so you can ensure you secure a time that is convenient for you. These conferences will take place after you receive your child's Mid-Year Report and will be an opportunity for you to gain a deeper understanding of their learning achievement at school. Mrs Eder (Room 18) will hold her conferences on the earlier date of Thursday 8<sup>th</sup> June and Mr Cade Armstrong (Room 22) on Monday 26<sup>th</sup> June. Separate letters will be sent home for these classrooms so you can arrange times through our school office.
