With the weather now a lot warmer and sunnier, we have relocated to an area with more shade when the tamariki eat their lunches. The widening of the William Street footpath is well underway. Isaac Construction have notified me that on Tuesday 7th November, the one-way system will extend to our school block and the detour for traffic heading up William Street to Hill Street, will move to a right turn at Edward Street (this is currently at Roeske Street). Our Henley School William Street carpark will still be open to cars, however at the exit it will be a right turn only until further notice. The pedestrian crossing will still be operating as usual if your children are walking to school or if you need to drop them off in Edward Street instead of William Street.
