You may have noticed the flags we had made with the Henley School High Five Values printed on them. Weather permitting, the flags will be out at the top steps each day, on display as a visual reminder to everyone, helping us to remember to implement these values in our interactions and learning. Our William Street carpark is a very busy place and we need your assistance to ensure it remains safe and the traffic flows through appropriately to keep our tamariki and whānau safe. When you drive into the car park to drop your children off, please drive as far around in the car park as you can, stopping to drop children safely as close to the walking paths as you can. Where possible, refrain from getting out of your vehicle, unless you have parked in a designated car park. Many cars are queuing on the road, to make a right turn into the car park, often making it impossible for the traffic to keep moving along William Street and blocking the pedestrian crossing. If you are unable to get into the car park, please drive on, park on the side of the street and walk back. When parking in the William Street carpark, please use the parking spaces only, not the mobility space unless you have a permit to do so nor on the actual driveway preventing traffic entering and exiting. At all times, we ask you to treat each other with our Henley High Five Value, one of respect.

Earlier this year schools across New Zealand were advised of the new rules and guidelines on minimising the use of physical restraint in schools. There is a strong focus on prevention, and they were created in response to educators, parents and disability groups seeking clarity on the use of physical restraint in schools and what is acceptable physical contact. All schools were required to have a physical restraint policy in place by the 7 May 2023. If you wish to read the Henley School policy, please contact the Henley School office. Teachers and authorised staff are required to complete a mandatory online training module by 7 February 2024. Many of our staff have already completed this and it is our plan that all will by the end of Term 3 2023. The Ministry of Education have asked schools to make their community aware of the changes mentioned above.
