The pathway and pedestrian crossing upgrades continue in William Street over the rest of the school term. This Friday 1st December, the William Street crossing will be closed for the upgrade. A temporary crossing will be implemented just to the west of the crossing and will lead directly up the pathway into the school at the William Street entrance. Isaac Construction and Henley School staff will be at the crossing each morning and afternoon to ensure it is safe for our students to cross. There will be a 'stop/go' sign instead of the usual road patrol 'lollipop' signs. We appreciate your patience with this. Please ensure you and your children cross at these safe points, visibility may be impaired due to the many road cones and gates that are being utilised.

On Friday 8th December the end of year school reports will be emailed home, this will include the classroom placement for your child if they are returning to Henley School in 2024. Please keep an eye out for an email earlier in the day that will have the school map for 2024 and teachers in each classroom. (Note, there are some teachers moving into different rooms.) Our staff have spent many hours over the last few weeks sorting 2024 class placements. It is a large jigsaw that requires many factors to be considered and we appreciate your trust with this process. Being a large primary school, we are fortunate to have several classes as options for placements in each syndicate, unlike smaller schools that may only have one option for each year level.
