A big thanks to Natalie Doty who stepped up as Acting Principal while I was away – thanks also to Leeanne Kyle and all the other staff who also supported the effective running of the school. I spent most of 2022 and 2023 supporting the leadership of 127 schools in the Nelson, Marlborough and West Coast regions along with working on some special projects. This role involved a huge amount of travel as many of our schools are very small (some with less than 10 students) and very remote (places like Haast, Franz Josef, Karamea and Waitaria Bay). It was a great opportunity to see schools across our region and the many and varied challenges they all have.



Our family had a short break over Christmas in the Kaikōura region as our daughter had a holiday job as a kayak guide there. We are also currently hosting an Austrian exchange student (Judith) so that means we get out and about a bit to show her the highlights of our region. Coming from a landlocked country she is particularly excited about our beaches. She is also very keen on animals and our dog Poppy gets a lot of extra attention. Poppy had a smooth return to Henley School last week and enjoyed finding her way around the school and meeting many of the children. Poppy also had a visit to the Waimea Kindergarten and was exhausted by last Friday night.

A gentle reminder that our William St and Gilbert St driveways are not to be used for picking up and dropping off your child/children and we appreciate your cooperation by parking in the carpark at the William Street entrance and using the pedestrian access up the driveway to the school. This minimises the risks to the large number of children we have on site. Thank you also to parents for sending your children correctly dressed in our compulsory school uniform. They look fantastic and we get many positive comments about them. As we are now in the swimming season it would be great if parents could ensure that items of clothing (including school hats) are clearly named.

Schools work best when communication lines are open and people feel comfortable to speak in a frank and honest way. If you do have any concerns regarding your child please make sure you discuss it with your child's teacher, the deputy principals (Natalie and Leeanne) or myself as soon as possible. Teachers are generally available in classrooms from 8.30am however it is often best to make an appointment if you have a concern that would be better discussed without the child being present or when more time is required. We will be having Parent/Teacher Conferences on **Tuesday 27**th **February** which will be an opportunity for parents to share relevant information with the class teacher and for you to gain an understanding of how your child is settling in. More details about arrangements for this will follow next week.
