Physical Education

Swimming is our focus for Term 1. We appreciate you supporting your child's participation by ensuring they bring their togs to school on their swimming days. A notice will be sent home when the season has ended. Our Swimming Sports are at Nayland Pool on March 1st. At this stage we are experiencing a low number of parents offering transport for this event. For the event to go ahead we rely on parent support.

It is also important for children to have a clearly named water bottle at school every day and wear suitable footwear, such as running shoes. A friendly reminder to check your child's uniform is clearly named, this allows items to be returned quickly to its owner.
